It is a land of contrasts that combines deserts, mountains, Mediterranean landscapes, subtropical islands, fjords, lakes, and glaciers... an ideal combination of virgin nature, services and security.

**Day 1 Santiago** • Upon arrival in Santiago, assistance and transfer to your hotel. In the afternoon, panoramic city tour of Santiago: Parade Grounds, the Cathedral, Presidential Palace "La Modena", Ahumada (Pedestrian Street), Old Santiago's main avenues and the Artisans Market.  
 Hotel: Eurotel El Bosque 3\* / Galerías 4\* (2 nights)

**Day 2 Santiago • Vina Del Mar • Valparaiso • Santiago** • Depart to Viña del Mar, Chile's garden town. Visit its beaches, modern buildings and beautiful gardens. Proceed to the port of Valparaiso and its suburbs. (B)

**Day 3 Santiago • Santa Cruz** • Morning departure towards Santa Cruz, situated in the lush Colchagua Valley. Visit one of the most important wineries in the area, where producing the finest Cabernet Sauvignon, Sauvignon Blanc or Chardonnay wines. Wine tasting included. After lunch, visit the Colchagua Museum (closed on Monday), with its collection of colonial art. Overnight in Santa Cruz. (B/L)  
 Hotel: Santa Cruz Plaza 4\* (1 night)

**Day 4 Santa Cruz • Santiago** • After breakfast, visit to two local wineries including wine tasting. After lunch, return to Santiago. (B/L)  
 Hotel: Eurotel El Bosque 3\* / Galerías 4\* (1 night)

**Day 5 Santiago • Calama • San Pedro de Atacama** • This morning, flight to Calama and transfer to your hotel in San Pedro de Atacama. In the afternoon, visit to the Salt Mountain range and the fabulous views it offers over the valley. Visit the Mars or Death Valley with its spectacular scenery. At dusk, climb a large sand dune in the Moon Valley for spectacular views of the sunset over the Andes Mountains. (B)  
 Hotel: La Casa de Don Tomas 3\* / Kimal 4\* (3 nights)

**Day 6 San Pedro de Atacama** • Visit the Padre Gustavo Le Paige Museum, where an important collection of the Atacaman culture is housed. Continue to the indigenous fort of Quito, built over 700 years ago as a defensive settlement. After lunch, visit Toconao, known as the "craftsmen's village". The locals work the liparite stone found here and many of the buildings are made of stone, unlike the rest in the area. Continue to the Chaxa Lagoon in the Atacama Salt Flat, where three varieties of flamingos can be viewed. (B)

**Day 7 San Pedro de Atacama** • Early departure to El Tatio geysers, where you will have a guided walk around the geothermal field to observe the huge steam columns that rise to the sky which are best appreciated in the cold dawn air as the sun rises over the Andes. The journey continues through the Andes Mountains, with wonderful views of the Putana volcano and the peaks of Torcopuri. Return to San Pedro early afternoon. (B)

**Day 8 San Pedro de Atacama • Calama • Santiago** • Transfer to Calama airport for your flight to Santiago. Rest of the day at leisure. (B)  
 Hotel: Eurotel El Bosque 3\* / Galerías 4\* (1 night)

**Day 9 Santiago** • Transfer to Santiago airport. (B)

**EASTER ISLAND**

**Day 1 Easter Island** • Reception at Easter Island airport and transfer to your hotel. Located 3,600 kilometers off the coast of Chile, Easter Island is the site of the famous Moai statues.

**Day 2 Easter Island** • In the morning you will visit Orongo, a ceremonial village located on top of Rano Kau, an inactive volcano. In this village you will see the characteristic stone houses and petroglyphs, as well as the magnificent crater and a panoramic view of the nearby islets. In the afternoon you will visit Ahu Akivi, made up of 7 moai that are said to represent Polynesian explorers. These are special because they are one of the few moai that overlook the ocean (normally the statues overlook inland). Then you will visit Puna Pau, where the island inhabitants got red rocks to carve hats for the Moai. (B)

**Day 3 Easter Island** • After breakfast depart for a full day excursion to some interesting spots in the island. Visit Vaihu, a platform made up of 8 laying statues and moai hats. Afterwards you will visit Rano Raraku Volcano. Here, you will see the quarry where all the moai were built. Once you climb up to the crater you will be able to see the largest collection of statues in the island: Ahu Togariki, enclosing 15 moai. Finally you will continue to Anakena beach, one of the only two true beaches in the island. It is said to be the first site to be inhabited in the island. (B/L)

**Day 4 Easter Island** • Transfer to Easter Island airport. (B)
