As part of the day tour guests will savour a delicious lunch at one of the excellent local cafes; a one hour hosted tour of Te Papa and a one hour hosted tour inside the Parliament buildings.

Today is at leisure to explore the many shops and cafes in the area until it's time for your night tour of Zealandia The Karori Sanctuary where you will discover the story of New Zealand's natural history and conservation movement with a brand new world-class interactive exhibition.
